DID YOU KNOW?

Khata is a traditional ceremonial or offering scarf used widely in Tibetan culture and in Buddhism for different Tibetan purposes. Tibetans believe that it started in the 7th Century AD during the rule of King Songtsen Gampo. He would present any minister or citizen who did a good job with the skin of a prized animal, like tigers, leopards, foxes or others. With the advent of Buddhism in Tibet in the 8th century as a state religion, the then King Trisong Detsen, Guru Rinpoche (Acharya Padmasambhava), Abbot Shantarakshita and others leaders, discouraged the giving of animal skin, as it required the killing of an animal for the fur or skin.
