DID YOU KNOW?



The Mahabodhi Temple (literally: "Great Awakening Temple") is an ancient, but much rebuilt and restored, Buddhist temple in Bodhi Gaya, marking the location where the Buddha is said to have attained enlightenment. The Mahabodhi Mahavihara is revered as the holiest place of Buddhist pilgrimage in the world. It is among the 84,000 shrines built by King Ashoka in the 3rd century BC. The site contains a descendant of the Bodhi Tree under which Buddha gained enlightenment, and has been a major pilgrimage destination for Hindus and Buddhists for well over two thousand years, and some elements date to the period of Ashoka (died c. 232 BCE).
