- **Tibet man attempts self-immolation near monastery in Qinghai**
A Tibetan man set himself on fire near a police station in a Tibetan region of northwestern China's Qinghai province and was immediately taken away by authorities with no word on his condition, sources in India said Thursday, a day after the incident. *(RFA)*
- **17th Tibetan Parliament passes official resolution for a review committee to probe prospect of Gangjong Finance**
An official motion and resolution to constitute a review committee to probe the prospect of Gang Jong Development Finance Private Limited (GDF) was passed with a high majority in the house today during the final day of the budget session of the 17th Tibetan Parliament-in-Exile. *(Tibet.net)*
- **Self-immolation Protest Reported at Kham Kyegudo in Tibet**
A self-immolation protest has been reported at Kyegudo in Tibet's traditional Kham province, according to confirmed information received from a source by the Central Tibetan Administration. The self-immolation protest reportedly took place in front of the Kyegudo police station at around 4:00 pm on 30 March 2022. *(Tibet.net)*
- **Denmark commission finds Copenhagen illegally silenced anti-China demonstrators**
The Tibet Commission found that Denmark's intelligence and security service used pressure to convince police in Copenhagen to stop all anti-China demonstrations, in violation of the country's constitution. *(RFA)*
- **China announces tit-for-tat visa ban plan on US officials**
China has announced on Mar 31 that it will impose visa restrictions against US officials in a tit for-tat move against a similar measure announced by the US State Department on Mar 21 against Chinese officials involved in "repressive acts" against ethnic and religious minority groups. *(Tibetan Review)*

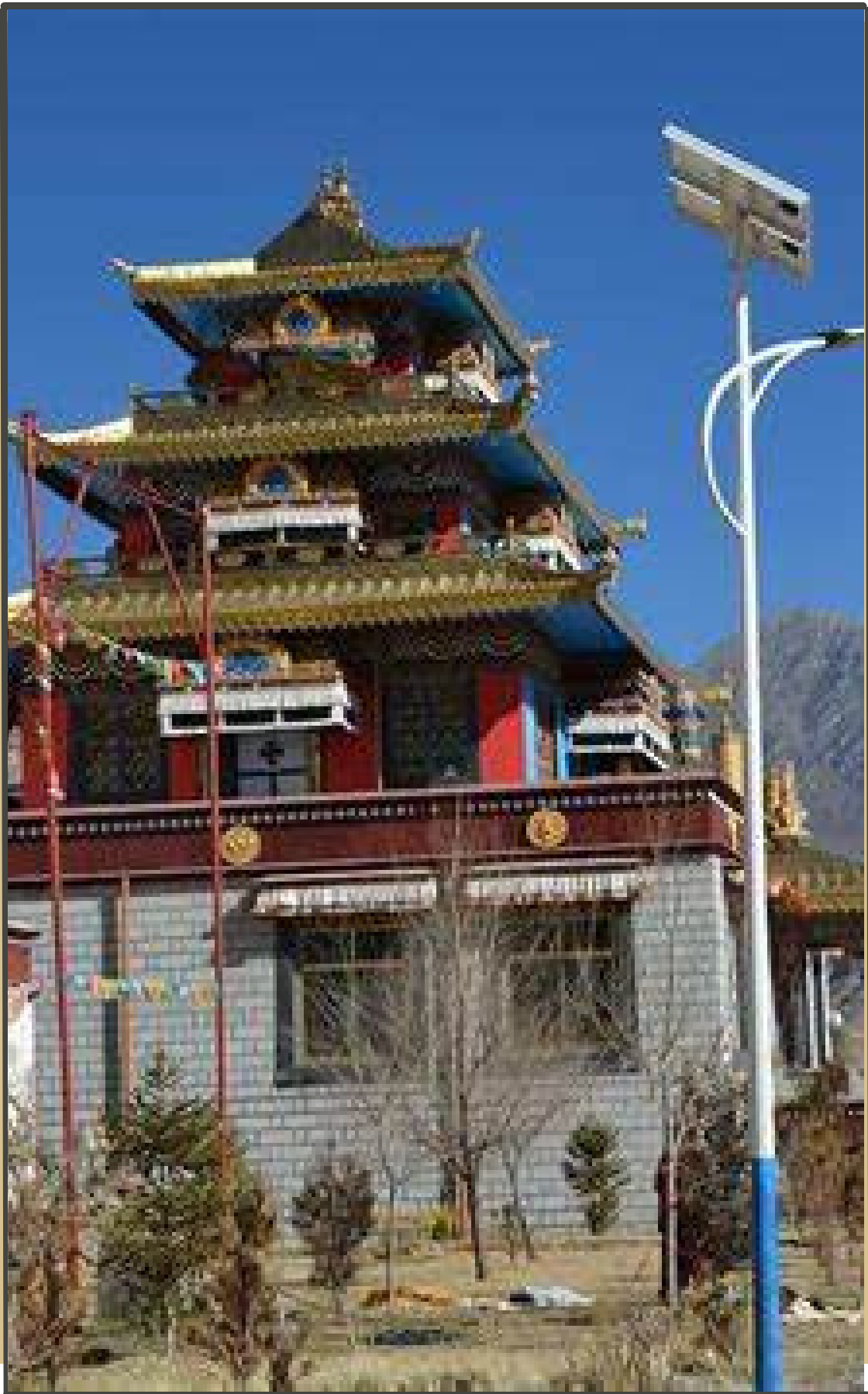

DID YOU KNOW?

Dorje Drak monastery lies on the northern bank of Yarlung Tsangpo at about 3550m above sea level. It is 18km east of the Gala Mountain tunnel and bridge leading to the airport in Tsedang Prefecture. Nowadays very few people still take the ferry across the Yarlung Tsangpo. However, it was the only way to reach the monastery until recently. Hardcore trekkers can approach Dorje Drak from Lhasa, which is a trek of around four days.
